Homework

Homework is important in helping you remember the work you have completed in class and also to extend your knowledge.

You will receive either a piece of Mathematics or English Homework weekly. You will be given this on Fridays and you need to return it the following Tuesday. You will also have weekly spellings linked to your sound, pattern and grammar work for that week.

In the Trinity Term you will receive two pieces of homework, one Mathematics and one English to complete each week.

Reading is very important and you will have a reading book to take home every night.

Your family would love to hear you read as often as possible so try to read each night if you are not too tired.

Home School Diary

Your Home School Diary is also very important; it allows your Class Teacher to give important messages to your family as well as giving you the chance to write your own reminders in your diary. You will be asked to make sure somebody at home signs your diary at the end of each week; you will earn a merit if they do!



You will be given the opportunity to go on a variety of trips during the year or you may be visited by someone special. These will relate to the work you are doing in class. At the end of the year, the Pre-Prep will go out for the day and enjoy some activities relating to your work you have completed throughout the year.



Merits

You earn merits for following The Barney Way. The merits are added up at the end of each term and a book token is awarded if you have accumulated the most merits.

The Rainbow Award Scheme is designed to reward you further. Every time you get to a coloured band on the rainbow you will be presented with a certificate in assembly.

We always expect your best behaviour, which will keep your name on the "Happy Board". If your teacher sees any thoughtless behaviour, they will speak to your family about this.

After School Activities

Activities take place in the School day at break time, lunch time and after School. These are delivered by School staff, as well as some external teachers and coaches.

A booklet which contains all the information about activities will be emailed to your parents before the start of each term. You should chat to your parents

about which clubs you would like to sign up for, and your parents will then complete the online form for you before the start of term.

Once you have started an activity, you are expected to attend every week until the end of term and to give your apologies to the member of staff running the club if you cannot attend.

There are so many activities to choose from, we are sure you will enjoy taking part in some of these!

Uniform

Your appearance is very important and you should always be dressed smartly in the correct uniform.

Hair must be tied back if it is shoulder length or longer. Short hair should be brushed and neat.

Your school shoes should be black or navy and you are responsible for ensuring they are polished every day.

It is anticipated that you will have two PE lessons a week and should come to School in your PE kit on these days, and your School Uniform on the other three days.

You will also go swimming every week using the Senior School pool.
